From this stop, a short walk along Durham Street North will take visitors to the Christchurch Casino and the eastern end of Victoria Street.



16 Victoria Square

The Avon River winds its way through Victoria Square, the perfect spot for a picnic or to relax. Watch the punts glide past on the river or enjoy a coffee at one of the cafes nearby.




17 New Regent Street




A full circuit on the Tram takes approximately 50 minutes. Trams run every 15 minutes. Children must be accompanied on the trams at all times by a paying adult. For safety reasons, we allow one adult to supervise up to five children or infants aged 15 years and under. Please note that children are classed as being 5-15 years of age and infants are classed as being under 5. Up to three children per paying adult are permitted to ride free of charge. Tickets can be purchased for \$5 each for additional children. Infants are free of charge.



6 The Crossing

At the point where the Tram lines cross over, visitors have easy access in either direction along High Street or the Cashel Street Pedestrian Mall.



11 Worcester Boulevard

This stop on Worcester Boulevard provides access to the historic Arts Centre Precinct, famous for its craft galleries, character shops, restaurants and entertainment.



7 Manchester Street

Here visitors will find good options for cafes and bars. From here the Tram returns in a westerly direction along High Street in the direction of Cathedral Square.



12 Museum & Botanic Gardens

Disembark here for the Canterbury Museum, the Botanic Gardens, i-Site visitor centre, the Botanic Gardens Tour, the shuttle bus to the Christchurch Gondola or an alternative access to the Arts Centre.



1 Cathedral Junction

Cathedral Junction is home to the Tramway ticket office, shops and cafes and is close to four of the city's best hotels.



4 The Terrace

A unique development to re-create a central retail and cultural precinct, the Container Mall complex has been developed using shipping containers and has become a main visitor attraction for Christchurch. Experience an impressive cluster of shops and cafes.



8 High Street

Currently an area under development, the Colombo Street & High Street corner will soon be a busy part of the city once again, with plans in place for shops, cafes and public spaces.



13 Hagley Park Corner

From here visitors can access North Hagley Park, the venue for many city events. Along the riverbank from this point you'll find another entrance to the Botanic Gardens and the new Gardens Visitor Centre and Café.



2 Cathedral Square

A shadow of its former self, Cathedral Square will soon be the hub of city activity once more and you can see the remains of the Christchurch Cathedral. A handy central stop for exploring the city centre.



3 Mill Island

Adjacent to the historic mill on the Island in the Avon River, this stop enables passengers to explore the new development along the bank of the river. An ideal place to relax and take in the tranquility of the area.



5 Ballantynes

This stop along the Cashel Street Mall provides an opportunity to visit the iconic Ballantynes Department Store which has survived for generations and is as 'Christchurch' as the city itself. This area is one of the four main pedestrian zones in the city centre.



9 City Punting

Here you discover one of two locations for Punting on the Avon. Explore the banks of the Avon River in both directions from this stop, which is situated on the Worcester Street Bridge.



14 Cranmer Square

One of several grassed squares which surround the central city, Cranmer Square is an area for rest and recreation. A short walk from the opposite side of the square is Victoria Street, an entertaining zone of newly developed bars, cafes and restaurants.



10 Art Gallery

From here visitors can view the Art Gallery. Recently renovated and re-opened, the Gallery features New Zealand, international and local art.
