A full circuit on the Tram takes approximately 50 minutes. Trams run every 10-15 minutes. Children must be accompanied on the trams at all times by a paying adult. For safety reasons, we allow one adult to supervise up to five children or infants aged 15 years and under. Please note that children are classed as being 5-15 years of age and infants are classed as being under 5. Up to three children per paying adult are permitted to ride free of charge. Tickets can be purchased for \$5 each for additional children. Infants are free of charge.

1 Cathedral Junction

Cathedral Junction is home to the Tram booking office, shops and cafes and is close to many of the city's best hotels.



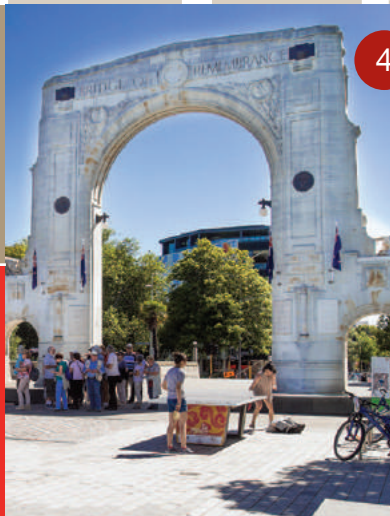
2 Cathedral Square

Cathedral Square will soon be the hub of city activity once more. See the remains of the Christchurch Cathedral, the new Central Library and the many food trucks. A handy central stop for exploring the city centre.



3 Mill Island & The Terrace

A new development, The Terrace complex boasts an array of bars, cafes and restaurants, and is a short stroll from stop 3 at Mill Island. The revitalised banks of the Avon River are an ideal place to relax and take in the tranquillity of the area.



4 Bridge of Remembrance

The ornate Memorial Arch of the Bridge of Remembrance is a favourite photo spot for both locals and tourists alike. The pedestrian mall of Cashel Street hosts a great selection of retail shops and cafés, and the Riverside Farmers' Market currently under construction will be a fantastic addition to this shopping precinct when it opens in 2019.



5 Ballantynes

This stop along the Cashel Street Mall provides an opportunity to visit the iconic Ballantynes Department Store which has survived for generations and is as 'Christchurch' as the city itself. This area is one of the four main pedestrian zones in the city centre.



6 The Crossing

At the point where the tram lines cross over, visitors have easy access to the shops and cafes along High Street or the Cashel Street Pedestrian Mall.



7 Manchester Street

Here visitors will find good options for cafes and bars. From here the Tram returns in a westerly direction along High Street in the direction of Cathedral Square.



8 High Street

High Street hosts a variety of shops and cafes, with plans in place for further development. The Transitional Cardboard Cathedral is a two-block walk along Hereford Street.



9 City Punting

Here you discover one of two locations for Punting on the Avon. Explore the banks of the Avon River in both directions from this stop, which is situated on the Worcester Street Bridge.



10 Art Gallery

From here visitors can view the Christchurch Art Gallery, featuring international and local art. Enjoy a coffee or glass of wine at one of the many cafes and bars nearby.



11 Christchurch i-SITE

This stop on Worcester Boulevard provides access to i-SITE Christchurch and the historic Arts Centre Precinct, famous for its craft galleries, character shops, restaurants and entertainment.



12 Museum & Botanic Gardens

Disembark here for the Canterbury Museum, Botanic Gardens Tour and Arts Centre. The Botanic Gardens are also well worth visiting, and the Park Punting site is a short walk away at the historic Antigua Boat Sheds.



13 Hagley Park Corner

From here visitors can access North Hagley Park, the venue for many city events and a popular walking spot.



14 Cranmer Square

One of several grassed squares which surround the central city, Cranmer Square is an area for rest and recreation. A short walk from the opposite side of the square is Victoria Street, an entertaining zone of bars, cafes and restaurants.
